**Aaliyah Jackson**

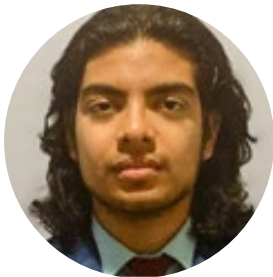
