<p style="text-align: center;">Person-centered Care (PC)</p> <p>Provide person-centered care that includes patient- and setting-specific assessment, evaluation, and management and healthcare that is evidence-based, supports patient safety, and advances health equity.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Professionalism and Ethics (PE)</p> <p>Demonstrate a commitment to practicing medicine in ethically and legally appropriate ways and emphasizing professional maturity and accountability for delivering safe and quality care to patients and populations</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Interpersonal & Communication Skills (CS)</p> <p>Demonstrate interpersonal and communication skills that result in the effective exchange of information and collaboration with patients, their families, and health professionals</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Practice-based learning and Quality Improvement (PBLQ)</p> <p>Demonstrate the ability to learn and implement quality improvement practices by engaging in critical analysis of one's own practice experience, the medical literature, and other information resources for the purposes of self-evaluation, lifelong learning, and practice improvement.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Knowledge for Practice (KP)</p> <p>Demonstrate knowledge about established and evolving biomedical and clinical sciences and the application of this knowledge to patient care.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Society and Population Health (SPH)</p> <p>Recognize and understand the influences of the ecosystem of person, family, population, environment, and policy on the health of patients and integrate knowledge of these determinants of health into patient care decisions.</p>
