To enhance their success fellows will be encouraged to submit proposals for competitive training certificate programs such as the AACR/ASCO Methods in Clinical Cancer Research Workshop, Pre-ASH Trainee Workshop, and ASH Research Training Award for Fellows.
- Encourage fellows to participate in Mayo Medical School 2nd year Hematology course to gain experience teaching, and hone their mentoring skills
