Florida Campus receives \$432 million for hospital expansion.



Mayo Clinic announces an expansion of the Mayo Clinic hospital in Florida. The project includes building five new floors atop the existing hospital tower – resulting in 121 new inpatient beds, including 56 ICU beds – with additional shelled space for future growth. Construction at the hospital in Jacksonville, Florida, is expected to begin later this year and will be completed by the end of 2026. “The

expansion of our hospital will enable Mayo Clinic to offer outstanding, high-quality care to more patients with serious and complex illnesses,” says Kent Thielen, MD, CEO of Mayo Clinic in Florida.
